Rock House



The Rock House, ancestral home of U.S. president Jimmy Carter, was built near present day Thomson in 1785 making it one of the oldest houses in Georgia.

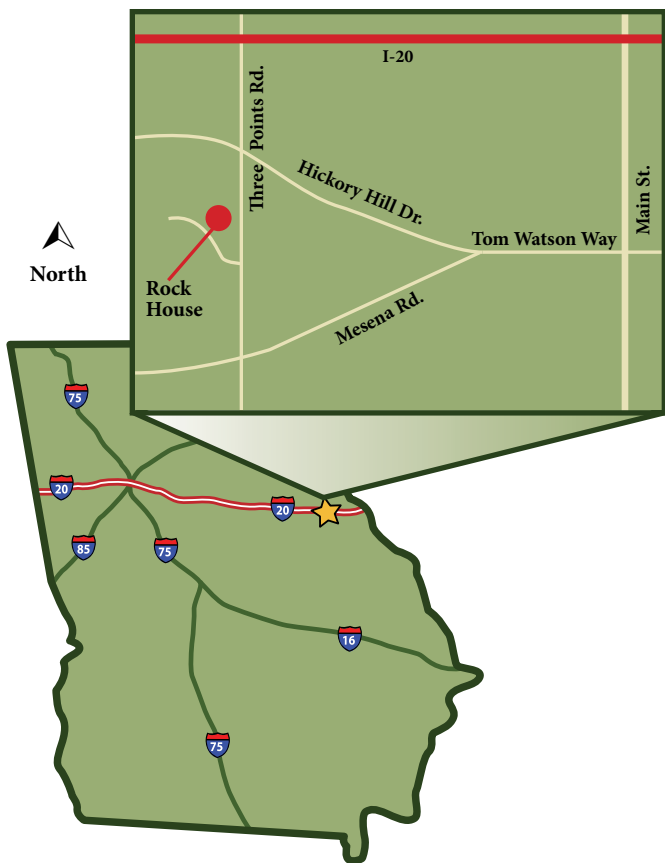
The design and construction are typical of the New Jersey area from which the Quakers, who settled in Wrightsborough, came.

The house was occupied continuously until the 1930s. It is now managed by the Wrightsboro Foundation, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



Directions:

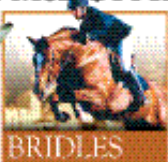
From Washington Rd. and I-20 (exit #172), travel south towards downtown Thomson (Washington Rd will become Main St.), turn right onto Tom Watson Way. At the fork in the road bear right, this is Hickory Hill Dr. Continue for 3.8 miles and turn left onto Three Point Rd. Continue for 1.2 miles and turn right onto the unmarked dirt road (this is Rock House Rd.). The house is about 1/4 of a mile down on the right side of the road.
