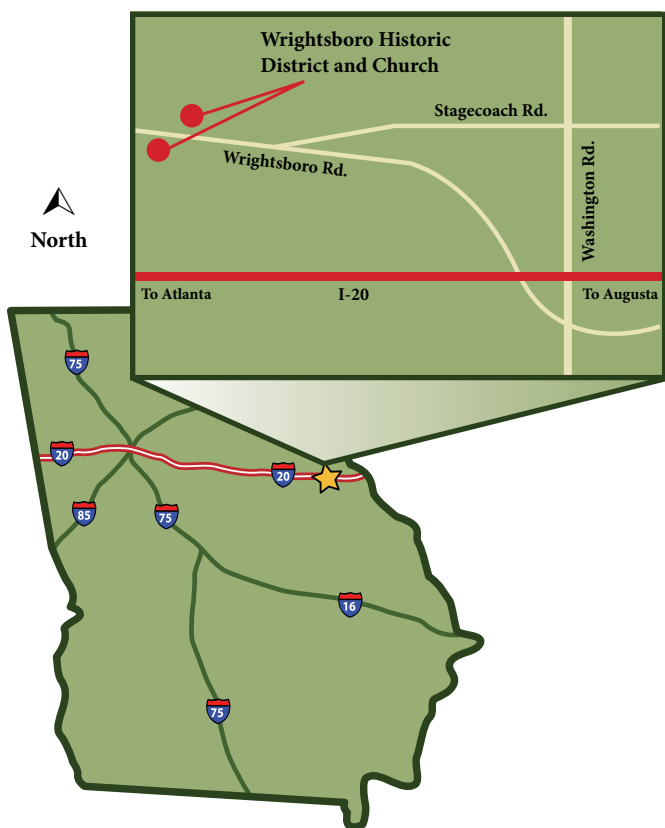
*The Wrightsboro Methodist Church of the Thomson Circuit, on the site of the defunct town of Wrightsborough, has been an active organization for over 125 years.*

*Several veterans of the Revolutionary War and some who died at Gettysburg, Shiloh and Fredericksburg in the War Between the States are buried in its historic churchyard.*



## Directions:

From Washington Rd. and I-20 (exit #172), travel north for 2 miles and turn left onto Stagecoach Rd. At the first stop sign turn right. About a mile down you will enter the old town. 1/4 of a mile from there the Wrightsboro Church is on the left.
